Riding to find a cure

More than 50 cyclists from across the Lower Mainland will click their feet into their pedals Saturday, beginning a 400-km trek from Kelowna to Vancouver as part of the fifth annual Ride2Survive cancer fundraiser.

The trek, which takes an estimated 15 hours and includes more than 12,000-feet of climbing, aims to raise money for the Canadian Cancer Society.

Last year, the ride raised \$258,000, and this year the riders are aiming to surpass the \$300,000 mark.

As of last week, 147 riders were signed up to take part. Two weeks ago, fifty of them met in South Surrey for a 200-km

training ride.
